The Low/High Shelf on its own, with those Low Freq and High Freq settings match turning up just the Bass or Treble knob on the Noble. I.e., to emulate the Bass knob fully CCW on the Noble, turn off the Parametric, set the Low Gain to 0.0, and use the High Gain like the Treble knob of the Noble (0 and positive only, remember). For example, +8.1 dB of High Gain is just like the Noble with Treble at 11 o'clock.

Likewise, setting the High Gain to 0.0 and using the Low Gain is like turning up the Bass knob. +8.5 dB matches the Noble with the Bass knob at 11 o'clock.

But it does not work to turn both the Low Gain and High Gain up to match knobs. The mid response does not work out correctly. Thus the mid parametric cut.

Matches from bottom to top the Noble preamp DI with both knobs at 10 o'clock. Bolded numbers are what changed from the knobs at 11 o'clock setting above.

So these three blocks are being ran in series?

Correct. It takes different EQ points and shapes to match the Noble curves exactly (< +/- 0.1 dB) from 20 Hz to 20 kHz.

For example, in the above two, the Parametric is being used to tweak close to the bottom and very top. If you add any HPF, LPF, or anything that rolls off the bottom and top as part of making your sound, the Parametric becomes meaningless.

You could also turn the Parametric on and off to see if you can even tell a difference. We are talking tenths of a dB.

7 presets:

- JKos1, JKos2 and JKos3 are as per my earlier post in Post [#4185](#), and use the full amp models (1&3)
  - Note, in my original post it refers to a "JKos" preset - this is now "JKos1"
- JKos1p and JKos3p use the preamp models (equivalent to JKos1 and JKos3)
- JKos4 and JKos4p are as follows (and use the full amp and preamp models respectively)
